Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Elizabeth Coffey, monitored your provision on 31/03/2015 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 04/03/2015, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The actions you were set are included at the end of this letter.

During the monitoring visit on 31 March 2015 the inspector discussed with you the steps you have taken to address the actions raised in the welfare requirements notice and notice to improve. Although no minded children were present she observed the resources and activities available for children and the areas, including the dedicated playroom, you use with minded children. The inspector looked at your records and documentation and the written polices and procedures you have in place.

The inspector found that you had taken steps to address all of the actions raised at your last inspection.

You have engaged with the local authority Early Years Advisory Team to address the issues raised at your inspection. This has enabled you to identify and access training and support to help improve your service. You have also enlisted the help of another registered child carer who has provided you with support in developing and maintaining required records including observations and assessments of children's learning and development.

You have completed safeguarding training and can now demonstrate a sound knowledge and understanding of your role and responsibilities in helping protect children from harm. You have updated your written safeguarding policy which now includes the action to be taken in the event of an allegation being made against you or a member of your household and the use of cameras and mobile phones. You have also reviewed and updated all other written policies and procedures, including

accidents and emergencies, complaints and health and safety. Polices and procedures are now stored in clearly marked files and available for inspection as required.

You are now recording children's attendance on a daily basis which contributes to ensuring children are kept safe while in your care. You have in place a fully equipped first aid box and have introduced a system for regularly checking that the contents of this are complete.

You have begun to make written observations of children's progress that are linked to the early learning goals and used to identify how you can support children's ongoing development. You have also introduced a daily dairy sheet which records children's daily care and activities and includes parent's feedback and comments. You have developed a basic understanding of the two year old progress check and how you will contribute to this. However your knowledge of this check is limited and you have not as yet had an opportunity to complete a two year old progress check.

Having considered all the evidence the inspector is of the opinion that at this time you have taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the childminder has taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Next steps

The next step will be further monitoring.
