Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The staff at the after school club provide a very welcoming and inclusive environment.
- Staff demonstrate a good knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage. They implement effective policies, procedures and risk assessments in line with these requirements. This means that staff are able to promote children's health, safety and well-being.
- There are robust systems in place for recruitment, checking suitability and induction of staff. The provider is confident that staff employed to work with children are suitable to do so.
- Leadership and management support staff's professional development through good supervision and coaching. They are able to access training through the local authority. This in turn promotes the outcomes for children.
- All staff have attended safeguarding children training. They understand their responsibilities in relation to child protection procedures.
- Leadership and management are evaluative about their provision of care. They meet regularly with staff to reflect on the activities they offer and their practice.
- Staff provide a broad range of toys, resources and activities. There are daily opportunities for children to be outdoors, which mean children benefit from fresh air and physical play after the school day.
- Staff have secure partnerships with the schools children attend and with their parents. This supports how staff complement the care children receive with others and promotes continuity in their learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed the premises indoors and outside. She observed the resources, toys and activities that staff offer children.
- The inspector spoke to older children, staff, the manager and the provider.
- The inspector spoke to the manager and provider about how they reflect on their practice to make priorities for the future.
- The inspector sampled the after school club's documentation.

Havelock Holiday and After School Club registered in 2001. It operates from Havelock School in Southall, and is managed by the London Borough of Ealing Play Services. The Holiday Club is currently not in operation. The After School Club is open from 3pm to 5.45pm Monday to Friday in school term time. Children attend from two nearby schools as well as the host school. There are currently no children on roll in the early years age range. Children have use of a large hall and outside play areas. There are three permanent staff. Two staff hold a qualification at level 3 and one staff member has a qualification at level 2.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
