## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- Children are offered plenty of space to play and learn in a vibrant, stimulating environment indoors and outdoors.
- Staff understand how children can be supported to behave well. They appreciate the importance of providing clear boundaries so that children know what is expected of them.
- The management team demonstrate, through discussion, a suitable awareness of the Early Years Foundation Stage. This includes ensuring staff suitability and notifying Ofsted of significant incidents and changes to the provision.
- Staff put strong emphasis on safeguarding children. Policies and procedures are in place to ensure that children's welfare and safety are protected.
- The management know to reflect on the quality of practice and take account of the views of staff, parents and children to identify strengths and address any areas where improvement will benefit the children.
- Staff understand how to promote children's well-being. Children are provided with a choice of healthy snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- Staff understand the importance of partnership working with parents and school. This ensures continuity of care, to meet the needs of all children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the indoor and outdoor areas and observed the suitability of resources and equipment for children.
- The inspector spoke to the manager and staff at appropriate times during the inspection.
- The inspector looked at children's records and a range of other documentation, including policies and procedures, and evidence of the suitability of staff working at the club.

Kirkham and Wesham B and A Club was registered in 2000. The club employs three members of childcare staff. Of these, two hold an appropriate early years qualification at level 3 and one holds level 2. The club opens from Monday to Friday during term time. Sessions are from 8am until 8.45am and 3.15pm until 5.45pm.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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
