Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has secure knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She meets all of the legal requirements and understands how to meet children's individual needs. She has a wide range of toys and resources, to provide challenge for children and engage their interest.
- The childminder understands how to use observations and assessments of children's progress to plan for their next steps in development. As a result, she understands how to provide children with stimulating and challenging activities to prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She will provide children with a choice of healthy meals and snacks, and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder plans to work closely with parents to ensure children's needs, such as dietary needs, are met. She will use a range of documentation to obtain necessary information about each child so that they can settle quickly. She understands how to manage children's behaviour positively.
- The childminder maintains and updates her knowledge of safeguarding requirements because she attends relevant training. She has sound safeguarding procedures to help to ensure children's safety and well-being in her home and in the community.
- The childminder understands the importance of monitoring the effectiveness of her practice through self-evaluation, and parents' and children's views, to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed how the childminder will deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector sampled policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children, including evidence of suitability of household members and the safeguarding policy.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the house and garden used for the care of children and discussed the toys, resources and equipment that the childminder has available.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder will promote the children's safety and welfare.

Access to the premises is by a flight of stairs outside and two small flights of stairs inside the home. The childminder works from Monday to Friday, all year round.
