Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Alison Frances Tranby, monitored your provision on 08/04/2015 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 25/02/2015, we sent you a welfare requirements notice. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

The welfare requirements notice required you to comply with the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage under the following requirement, Safeguarding and staff suitability. The steps you were required to take were detailed in full in the notice sent to you on 30 March 2015. You were also sent notices to improve, in relation to; Risk assessment, premises, safeguarding practice, educational programmes, and planning and assessment of children's progress. These were detailed in full in the letter sent to you on 30 March 2015. A monitoring visit completed on 8 April 2015 found that you had met the welfare requirement notice. It was also established that you had failed to meet some of the notices to improve in that you failed to meet the educational programmes, planning and assessment of children's progress.

During the visit the manager demonstrated implementation of additional safeguarding policies to include staff no longer being able to use their mobile phones. Recruitment procedures have improved and references have now been obtained for all staff members from their previous employer. Children can no longer access the internet due to safety measures being initiated with regard to disabling the Wi-Fi system. Staff have been more thorough in risk assessment, they ensure a system is in place to monitor the serving of hot food. They have improved the safety of the indoor and outdoor play provision, to ensure hazards are identified and removed. Sleeping babies are now more closely monitored.

The manager informed the inspector that support is now being obtained from the local authority Early Years and Childcare Team to assist with improving the nursery's understanding of learning and development. The manager and deputy manager have



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also been working one-to-one with staff to strengthen their knowledge of educational programmes and planning the activities and monitoring children's progress. An action plan is being devised by the management team to support staff and enable them to confidently monitor children's progress and plan for their individual learning needs. This practice is not yet secure and remains an area of weakness which will be monitored further at the next visit.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has not taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.

Next steps

The next step will be further monitoring.
