## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn. She is clear about providing a mix of adult-led and child-initiated activities, together with a range of toys, equipment and resources for children of all ages and abilities.
- The childminder is aware of the need to assess children's progress and plan what they need to learn next, and to provide a progress check for parents when children are two.
- The childminder understands the importance of safeguarding children, including the need to risk assess her premises.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of maintaining children's good health, and promoting healthy lifestyles, including time outdoors daily.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and carers. She understands the need to share information about how her setting is run, the children's activities and their progress
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her practice and consider areas she would like to develop, including seeking further training.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of safeguarding matters and how to respond to any child protection concerns to help protect children's welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed the childminder's plans for meeting the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector looked at samples of the childminder's previous risk assessments and discussed her policies and procedures.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the premises the childminder intends to use for childminding purposes.
