The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of how to engage children so they enjoy learning. She demonstrates knowledge of how to monitor their achievements, track their progress and plan for their continued learning.
- The childminder has a very good understanding of how to safeguard children's welfare. She updates her safeguarding and first-aid training regularly and knows how to support children's well-being effectively.
- The childminder has a very positive attitude towards providing a service that is inclusive to all children. She has a variety of play resources and activity plans that embrace all cultures and abilities, to promote a culture of respect and understanding.
- The childminder is well-organised and values partnership working with parents and others. She has procedures for sharing information between all those involved with the children's care and learning to ensure consistency.
- The childminder is passionate about promoting healthy lifestyles by encouraging children to be active and develop good health through exercise and food.

There were no children present when this inspection took place.
