Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to plan and provide a suitable range of resources and activities to promote children's progress and help them develop the required skills for their future learning.
- The childminder understands the need to work in partnership with parents. She knows that she needs to keep parents informed of their children's progress and share information to support children's care and learning needs.
- The childminder understands how to protect children's welfare. She knows how to follow child protection procedures in the event of having a concern about a child's welfare. She knows how to keep children safe in her home and on outings by completing regular checks to help identify and reduce potential hazards.
- The childminder knows how to provide a welcoming and inclusive environment to make all children feel welcome. She has a suitable range of toys and resources to meet the needs of children of all ages.
- The childminder demonstrates that she is able to make continuous improvements. She has addressed recommendations previously made. She understands how to use observations of children to identify the next steps in their learning. She continues to attend training and review her practice to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that are available for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will safeguard children.
