## **Summary of key findings for parents**

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands how to observe and assess children's progress, as well as the importance of providing activities and experiences that engage and challenge children appropriately.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of safeguarding requirements and child protection procedures. She understands how to help protect the welfare of children and the procedures to follow should she have a concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder has a valid paediatric first-aid qualification so that she can correctly deal with accidents or injuries to children. She understands how to minimise risks to children's safety, by implementing suitable measures in her home and on outings.
- The childminder understands the importance of forming warm relationships with children, to support their emotional well-being and to give them confidence to take part in learning activities. She recognises that this prepares children for the next stages in their learning, such as school.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents, other professionals and staff at other settings that children attend, to ensure children receive continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to develop her provision. She attends training when she can to maintain her professional development and further enhance her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
