# Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- Staff demonstrate a good capacity to maintain continuous improvement. They have addressed the actions from the last inspection, for example, by developing a secure knowledge and understanding of how to safeguard and protect children.
- Staff understand how to promote children's emotional and physical well-being. Effective key person arrangements mean that children have a special person who tailors their care and from whom to seek comfort.
- Staff carry out effective risk assessments and explain how they keep a good level of vigilance to keep children safe. Staff and owners are suitably checked and hold paediatric first-aid qualifications. This ensures that children are protected and cared for in a safe environment
- The managers and staff have good knowledge of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage as many staff work in other early years settings. They demonstrate that planning ensures a balance of adult-led and child-initiated activities based on children's individual interests to support their overall progress.
- The environment is warm, friendly and welcoming. There is a good variety of toys, resources and equipment to cover all areas of learning and to meet the needs of different age groups of children

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the staff how they provide activities that interest and engage children, and support their overall development.
- The inspector looked at the provider's policies and documents that the staff use when caring for early years children.

The Bee Hive Club, Highworth registered in 2008. It operates from a mobile classroom in the grounds of Southview Junior School, in Highworth, Wiltshire. The club opens daily in term time from 3pm to 6pm. There are three staff members who work with the children, all of whom have appropriate qualifications at level 3. There were no children present in the early years age group at the time of this inspection.
