## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She considers how to plan for individual children's needs and monitor their progress. She has a good range of play materials and resources that cover all areas of learning.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. She will teach them about leading healthy lifestyles through regular exercise and healthy diet and routines, such as hand washing.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour through clear and consistent boundaries. This helps to ensure that children learn what is expected of them.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She understands her responsibility to protect the welfare of children. She addresses risks to her home and provides a clean and welcoming environment.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals to share information and provide continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to make continuous improvements to her practice. She has addressed items raised at her previous inspection. She gains the views of parents and children to help improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
