The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning and development. She knows how to provide activities that follow children's interests and meet the needs of the children of differing ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder provides a welcoming and safe environment where children can select from a suitable range of toys and equipment. This enables children to make choices in their play.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She incorporates their knowledge of their children into planning. Parents are also encouraged to share their views about her provision.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She has policies that meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and follow the Local Safeguarding Children Board guidance.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to learn how to keep themselves safe and healthy. She provides a range of meals and snacks. She also helps children to learn how to keep themselves safe and manage their own behaviour.
- The childminder takes appropriate action to maintain an up-to-date knowledge and understanding of childcare practice through her attendance at relevant training courses.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
