Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Staff understand how to provide an interesting and enjoyable experience for children. They demonstrate how they will consistently encourage the children to decide which activities they want to do. This includes the opportunity to participate in forest school outings. They explain how they provide support to complement younger children's learning at school, where appropriate.
- Staff demonstrate how they effectively promote children's safety. For example, they risk assess the outdoor area taking into account other users of the premises. They understand the need to undertake careful monitoring of children's use of the internet. Staff have knowledge of child protection procedures and understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of the children in their care.
- Staff have a suitable understanding of how to evaluate the setting. They regularly undertake questionnaires with parents and carers. They acknowledge the importance of encouraging children to post suggestions and also asking them to evaluate the success of activities.
- Staff understand how to promote children's well-being. They demonstrate that they are able to provide children with healthy snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- Parents of older children who attend the club report that they are very pleased with the service provided. They state that staff are warm and friendly and genuinely care about the children. They say that staff keep them well informed about what their child has been doing. They also comment that their children love coming to the club and enjoy the range of activities on offer.
- Staff demonstrate a suitable understanding of how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. They understand the importance of attending any multi-agency meetings and sharing this information with staff in the setting. This is so that all staff can give appropriate support to children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the provider how they plan the activities.
- The inspector looked at documents the provider uses when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider their self-evaluation form and evaluation procedures.
- The inspector viewed the areas accessed by the children, including the resources and the outdoor environment.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability, qualifications and training of staff working with children and the provider's self-evaluation form.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents and carers spoken to on the day and from information included in the setting's own parent survey.

Cared 4 Kids Club (William Lilley) is one of three settings owned by the same provider. The out of school and holiday club was registered in 1999 and is based on the site of William Lilley Infant School. The club employs 12 members of childcare staff. Of these, 10 hold appropriate early years qualifications. The club opens Monday to Friday from 7.30am to 9am and 3pm to 6pm term time and 7.30am to 6pm in the school holidays. The club supports children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.
