- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to monitor and assess children's achievements. She knows how to plan a range of activities to support their progession in all areas of learning in response to individual needs and abilities.
- The childminder has an effective understanding of safeguarding procedures and has completed training. She knows how to identify and report any concerns to maintain children's well-being.
- The childminder develops her skills by completing further training and explains how she evaluates her practice to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows the importance of establishing good relationships with parents. She describes how she encourages them to share knowledge of their child and how she shares information with them.
- The childminder has a good awareness of promoting diversity. She provides resources and celebrates various festivals, which encourage children to have positive attitudes to others.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to promote children's well-being and develop their self-motivation and confidence. She explains how she ensures she meets children's emotional and physical needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
