- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of how young children learn. She knows how to promote the learning and development of children of different ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder understands the importance of assessing children's abilities and using this information to provide activities that are interesting and challenging. She keeps up to date with changes in legislation to ensure she fully understands her role.
- The childminder understands the safeguarding and welfare requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She knows how to plan for children's safety and security well. She understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating and daily exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other providers. She is aware of the need to share information between the provision and home in order to meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder has a comprehensive range of policies and procedures, including risk assessments to help her manage her provision and guide her practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping her skills and knowledge up to date and the need to regularly review and evaluate her own practice to improve it further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
