## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder shows a secure knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands how children learn and develop and therefore, has a wide range of toys and resource available to promote their learning experiences.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles for children by offering nutritional foods and regular opportunities for physical exercise.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of her role to safeguard children. She is aware of safeguarding procedures and ensures the premises are well maintained and secure.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnership with parents and others providers that children may attend to provide continuity in their care and education.
- The childminder has a thorough understanding of the required documents for the Early Years Foundation Stage, which she has readily available. This demonstrates a commitment to improvement and reflective practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector observed the premises intended for childminding purposes, including the outdoor area.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her role and responsibilities in meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
