## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of how to work in partnership with parents. She has good knowledge of how to ensure the settling in process supports the children's and parents' needs.
- The childminder has good methods for sharing information with parents about their children. She understands how to communicate effectively and give parents opportunities to provide comments or feedback concerning their children.
- The childminder is aware of how to provide a healthy, balanced diet for children, to promote their physical well-being. She has a good awareness of the need to provide children with outdoor play to support children's physical development.
- The childminder is aware of how to implement hygienic practices when caring for children. She also has knowledge of how to encourage children to be independent with their own personal care needs.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of safeguarding and possible child protection issues. She has a good awareness of what to do to keep children safe and has attended safeguarding training.
- The childminder has a good awareness of how to provide a varied and challenging learning environment for children, to help them develop new skills.
- The childminder has good knowledge of how to meet the learning and development requirements. She has attended training to increase her knowledge of how to observe and assess children's learning, to help children progress well.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
