The setting **does not meet legal requirements for early years settings**

Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not complied with the legal requirement to have public liability insurance in place. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and how children learn best through play.
- The childminder is aware of the need to complete regular observations and assessments of children's development, and understands how to involve parents in their children's learning. She can effectively explain how she promotes all areas of learning and how she works in partnership with other settings that children attend to promote continuity in their learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of her role and responsibility to safeguard children. She has clear processes in place should she be concerned about a child's welfare. She has risk assessed her home to identify and minimise any potential hazards. She is therefore able to provide a safe environment in which children can play.
- The childminder is able to demonstrate how she promotes children's good health. For example, she would provide outdoor activities and teach children good hygiene practices. The childminder has a good awareness of how to effectively manage children's behaviour to support their emotional development.
- The childminder has a strong awareness of the importance of forming strong attachments with the children and effective partnerships with their parents to help children settle and feel secure.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- obtain public liability insurance

To meet the requirements of the Childcare Register the provider must:

- obtain public liability insurance (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- obtain public liability insurance (voluntary part of the Childcare Register).

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked the indoor and the outdoor areas that will be used for the childminding provision.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about her understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector looked at and discussed policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and qualifications of the childminder and household members and discussed how she evaluates her provision and plans further improvements.

The childminder was registered in 2011. She lives in Long Ditton, Surbiton, Surrey in a converted Victorian house on the second floor with two flights of stairs. The childminder is available on a part time basis from 7am to 6pm all year round, except bank holidays and family holidays.
