- The childminder's home is warm, spacious and welcoming. She provides a range of good quality toys and resources.
- The childminder understands the need to promote children's good behaviour. She recognises the importance of praise as a method of boosting children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The childminder understands the need to assess the safety of her home and garden to help her to provide a safe environment for children's use.
- The childminder has undertaken safeguarding training. She knows how to recognise signs that a child may be at risk of harm.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflecting on her provision. She has successfully addressed the recommendation from her last inspection.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
