Monitoring for provision judged as inadequate

An Ofsted inspector, Alison Frances Tranby, monitored your provision on 15/05/2015 following your inspection where the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Outcome of monitoring

As a result of our inspection on 15/05/2015, we sent you a notice to improve. If you were set actions at the inspection, or as a result of our subsequent monitoring or investigations, these are included at the end of this letter.

During the visit the manager demonstrated that she has implemented the action plan developed through the support from the local authority Early Years and Childcare Team, to assist with improving the nursery's understanding of learning and development. It was found that staff's knowledge and understanding is still limited in terms of teaching and monitoring of children's progress. Staff were acting in a caring role for the children rather than engaging in activities and demonstrating a clear understanding the stages of development of individual children in order for them to plan the next stage of learning.

It was also found that the improvement of the safety of the indoor and outdoor play provision has not been maintained. The inspector identified other hazards with regards to the storage of some play equipment. This posed a risk to children and a welfare requirement notice has been issued again.

The manager and deputy manager have also been working closely with the early years advisor to enable staff to strengthen their knowledge of educational programmes, planning the activities and monitoring children's progress. They have devised an action plan to support staff and enable them to confidently monitor children's progress and plan for their individual learning needs. This is not yet embedded and therefore practice is not yet secure and remains an area of weakness which will be monitored further at the next visit.

Having considered all the evidence, the inspector is of the opinion that the setting has not taken prompt and effective action to address the points for improvement.
