The setting **does not meet legal requirements for early years settings**

Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not updated her paediatric first-aid training and does not have public liability insurance. Consequently, she cannot demonstrate her understanding of how to continually promote children's welfare.
- The childminder does not have current policies and procedures stating how she will safeguard children. This means she is unable to demonstrate how she could respond swiftly to any child protection concerns that may arise.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands how to use assessment to recognise children's individual needs and support their progress.
- The childminder has suitable risk assessment procedures which ensure the premises are kept safe and secure when children attend her provision.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to promote children's physical well-being. She understands the importance of supporting children to develop a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating, physical activity and developing good hygiene practices.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support children's well-being, learning and development.
- The childminder knows how important it is to establish trusting relationships with children, encourage good behaviour and help children to cooperate and make friends. She understands how this helps children feel emotionally supported and enables them to manage changes, such as going to school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- attend and complete appropriate paediatric first-aid training
- develop safeguarding policies and procedures in line with current guidance from the Local Safeguarding Children Board so that any child protection concerns can be reported without delay
- ensure that public liability insurance is held.

To meet the requirements of the Childcare Register the provider must:

- keep and implement a written statement of procedures to be followed for the protection of children, intended to safeguard the children being cared for from abuse or neglect (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- ensure that an appropriate first-aid qualification is held (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- ensure that they are covered by their own insurance in respect of liability which may be incurred for death, injury, public liability damage or other loss (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- keep and implement a written statement of procedures to be followed for the protection of children, intended to safeguard the children being cared for from abuse or neglect (voluntary part of the Childcare Register)
- ensure that an appropriate first-aid qualification is held (voluntary part of the Childcare Register)
- ensure that they are covered by their own insurance in respect of liability which may be incurred for death, injury, public liability damage or other loss (voluntary part of the Childcare Register).

Inspection activities

- The inspector conducted a tour of the areas used for childminding.
- The inspector had a discussion with the childminder about how she plans to meet the learning and development requirements when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she maintains a safe environment for children.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed the ways in which the childminder evaluates her provision in order to bring about improvement.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's training and qualifications.
