## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a robust safeguarding policy and has good knowledge of the procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child who may be at risk of harm. She has sound written procedures with contact information for the relevant authorities which she can use if she needs to make a referral.
- The childminder provides a varied range of resources to promote children's learning. She understands how to support children as they learn through play, regardless of their ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder provides a clean and welcoming environment and understands how to promote children's health and well-being. She understands how to meet children's emotional needs when they are new to her setting.
- The childminder has good knowledge of the areas of learning and knows how to plan for children's learning using her observations of children's achievements and interests. She has good knowledge of children's development and knows how to recognise when children may need additional support in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and keeping them fully informed about their child's progress and welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector reviewed the childminder's policies and procedures, and discussed these with the childminder.
- The inspector reviewed the areas of the childminder's home used for childminding, and the resources she provides to promote children's learning.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to establish her understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector reviewed a range of documentation including qualification and suitability paperwork.
