## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children and to provide children with a safe and secure environment.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's good health and well-being. She holds a current first aid qualification and public liability insurance.
- The childminder is aware of her role to work in partnership with parents and other early years providers to help her provide for children's care and development.
- The childminder knows the importance of planning activities that promote children's learning and development. She has a wide range of toys and play equipment to make sure that all children can take part in play activities. She knows how to organise her resources to encourage the children to make independent choices and follow their interests.
- The childminder understands the need to check children's achievements to help children to move to the next stage in their development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continuing to review her childminding provision to develop her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the spaces, toys, resources and equipment available for use.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about her childminding responsibilities to keep children safe and healthy, and how she plans to provide activities for children to help them progress.
- The inspector read relevant documents, and checked the childminder knows what records she needs to keep, and the policies and procedures she must have.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of how to improve her provision.
