Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not updated her first-aid training to be certain that she can competently administer correct treatment to children in the event of an emergency.
- The childminder understands how she will promote children's development in all areas of learning. She has a wide range of resources that meet the needs of children of differing ages, abilities and backgrounds. She has good procedures in place to regularly check the progress children make.
- The childminder demonstrates, through discussion, that she has a good understanding of how to protect children in her care. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse, to help her recognise when children may be at risk of harm, and is confident to report concerns in line with guidelines for the Local Safeguarding Children Board.
- The childminder knows how to build successful partnerships with parents, to ensure that a consistent approach to learning is planned.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate the service she offers. She understands the importance of seeking the views of parents and children to identify areas for improvement.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting the health and safety of the children in her care. She has assessed the potential risks to children within her home and plans on completing daily risk assessments to maintain a safe environment for children.
- The childminder understands the importance of meeting children's physical needs, of children enjoying fresh air every day and of helping children establish healthy habits.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

ensure a current paediatric first-aid qualification is obtained and maintained.

To meet the requirements of the Childcare Register the provider must:

 ensure that an appropriate first-aid qualification is held (compulsory part of the Childcare Register).

Inspection activities

- The inspector held a discussion with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to plan and provide learning experiences for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises where childcare is to be provided.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's methods for reviewing the quality and effectiveness of her provision.
- The inspector looked at a selection of documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector viewed evidence of the suitability of all adults living in the childminder's home.
