The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a wide range of resources to meet the learning and development needs of children aged from babies to school age.
- The childminder has a sound knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She fully understands the importance of assessment and her responsibility for providing a stimulating learning environment for children to help them make progress so that they are ready for school.
- The childminder is aware of how to provide a safe environment for the children and understands how to reduce risks to keep children safe and the need to teach them to keep themselves safe.
- The childminder understands how to meet children's individual physical needs and how to manage their behaviour in a positive way.
- The childminder has sound knowledge of child protection matters and knows what to do if she has a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the need to keep improving her service for children and families. She has completed the recommendation from her previous inspection to improve safety for children. She understands the importance of evaluating her service and the need to keep her knowledge and skills up to date, including her first aid certificate.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
