Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of how to support children's learning. She has a wide range of toys and ideas to help her meet children's interests and learning needs. This includes toys that will reflect children's own experiences as well as people in the wider community.
- The childminder is able to demonstrate how she will assess children's learning and monitor their progress. She is able to identify the key skills children will need for school and how she will plan to support the next stages in their learning.
- The childminder is committed to working closely with parents. She understands the benefits of sharing information so that children settle, feel secure and receive all the help they need to make progress.
- The childminder has carefully considered how to support children's well-being. Her home is welcoming and she recognises how important it is for them to feel safe and secure.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children about being healthy. She knows to provide healthy food and to teach children hygiene routines.
- The childminder has comprehensive policies and procedures to support and guide her practice. She fully understands her role and responsibility for child protection and in ensuring children are safe.
- The childminder regularly attends training to develop her professional knowledge and understanding. She evaluates her service to help her identify areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's learning and development needs and monitor their progress.
- The inspector viewed all areas of the premises that children will use.
- The inspector looked at documents and discussed the policies and procedures the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector took account of the childminder's self-evaluation and future plans.
