

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

We carried out an inspection which judged that the overall effectiveness of the setting was inadequate and did not meet the needs of the children who attend.

Following the inspection we issued a welfare requirements notice that required the provider to:

implement child protection procedures at all times and share information with relevant agencies without delay

ensure staff and children are not exposed to risks and demonstrate how risks are managed

ensure that all areas are clean and hygienic in order to comply with hygiene requirements, with particular regard to kitchen areas, toilets, sinks, bins and furniture.

It is offence not to comply with a welfare requirements notice.

We visited the nursery on 13 July 2015. The inspector found that the nursery staff and management team had worked hard to comply with the welfare requirements notice. Leaders and managers devised an action plan and arranged meetings and training for staff. Risk assessments were detailed and the all areas were safe. The nursery premises had undergone a deep clean and been reorganised to create more space. Toilets, sinks and the kitchen area were clean and hygienic. Leaders and managers worked closely with the local authority to ensure that the child protection policy is understood so that it can be implemented effectively when necessary. The inspector concluded that the management and staff team had taken prompt and effective action

and found them to be enthusiastic about driving improvement.
The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
