## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The manager does not ensure that at least one member of staff caring for children holds a valid paediatric first-aid certificate. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements.
- The manager and staff know how to plan a variety of fun and exciting activities with the children. They understand the importance of offering a range of resources and opportunities to capture children's interests and promote their independence.
- The manager understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She is confident of the procedures to follow should she be concerned about children's welfare. In addition, all staff access regular safeguarding training, to update their knowledge.
- The manager understands the importance of improving the provision. This includes taking into account children's and staff's views to identify strengths and areas for improvement.
- The manager and staff know how to provide a secure environment for children to play in. They understand how to conduct daily checks to ensure the premises are safe and secure.
- The manager and staff understand the importance of maintaining all the required documentation for recording accidents, incidents and medication.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- ensure that at least one member of staff who is caring for children has a valid paediatric first-aid qualification.

### To meet the requirements of the Childcare Register the provider must:

- ensure that at least one person who is caring for children has an appropriate first-aid qualification (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- ensure that at least one person who is caring for children has an appropriate first-aid qualification (voluntary part of the Childcare Register).

### Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas of the premises used by the children.
- The inspector spoke to the manager about her knowledge and understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation, including policies and procedures, registration form and accident records.
- The inspector viewed the resources available to children.

Camp Adventure play scheme registered in 2011. It operates from Sidcup Leisure Centre, Sidcup, Kent. It is open during all school holidays, except Christmas, from 8am to 6pm. Six members of staff work with the children, two of whom hold relevant qualifications at level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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
