Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to implement the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage to meet the needs of children of different ages, abilities and backgrounds. She understands the benefits of observing and assessing children's progress in order to plan for the next steps in their learning and help prepare them for school.
- The childminder is aware of how to maintain children's good health and teach them about healthy lifestyles which support children's well-being effectively.
- The childminder demonstrates a good awareness of how to keep children safe in her care. She is confident in the referral process should she have any concerns about a child's welfare. Risk assessments identify and minimise hazards to ensure children play environment is safe for children's use.
- The childminder has clear arrangements for evaluating her practice. She reads childcare publications and uses childminding forums to keep updated with current issues. She has addressed all recommendations from the last inspection, which demonstrates her strong capacity to improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her arrangements to meet the individual needs of children and to deliver a suitable range of play experiences.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she safeguards children in her care.
- The inspector checked the arrangements for promoting healthy lifestyles for children.
- The inspector discussed some of the policies and procedures that the childminder uses.
