## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands to provide a balance of toys and resources to support children's development in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands how to use the information gained from observations and assessments to plan for children's individual needs and stage of development.
- The childminder knows the importance of providing children with daily outdoor experiences to promote their physical development and good health.
- The childminder recognises the need to work with parents and other providers to provide a consistent approach to children's learning and care.
- The childminder shows understanding of how to prepare children for the next stage in their learning and their move to school or nursery. She understands the importance of promoting their independence and personal care skills.
- The childminder shows a positive attitude to keeping updated with current practice. She attends appropriate training to develop her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder shows understanding of her safeguarding responsibilities. She knows the signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
