## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder shows knowledge of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She is aware of how to promote children's learning to help prepare them for school.
- The childminder shows understanding of identifying children's next steps in learning and monitoring their progress through using observation and assessments.
- The childminder is aware of gaining parents and children's feedback to support her self-evaluation and practice.
- The childminder has a wide variety of resources available for children to promote all areas of learning and development.
- The childminder shows understanding of supporting children's awareness of healthy practices, including good hygiene and eating well.
- The childminder shows she understands and knows safeguarding procedures and how to promote children's safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's learning and emotional well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
