Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has clear knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare, and learning and development requirements. She has a good variety of resources to meet the needs of a range of children. The childminder has fully met the recommendations of the last inspection and has an astute improvement plan in place.
- The childminder demonstrates good understanding of how to support children's health and wellbeing. She walks children to and from school and takes them to the park most days. The childminder realises the importance of taking opportunities, such as during meals and walks, for children to talk about their feelings and anxieties.
- The childminder has established suitable processes for assessing, tracking and planning for children's progress to support their future learning. Records and wall displays show children have recently been learning about the human body, and the lifecycle of frogs and butterflies.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and external agencies involved with children to help ensure children receive consistent support.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of child protection matters. She has suitable procedures for supporting children's safety in the home and on outings.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children and how she meets the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at the records and documentation the childminder uses, including those related to safeguarding and the childminder's suitability to work with children.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the premises, garden and play resources.
