The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of developing a good partnership with parents to help her know and meet the individual needs of children. She is aware of gaining information from parents about their children to help them settle in her care and feel safe and secure.
- The childminder shows understanding of how to monitor and reflect on her childcare practice. She attends training and meetings to help keep her childcare knowledge updated.
- The childminder has a range of resources and toys available suitable for different ages of children. She shows understanding of completing observations and assessments of children's learning to help her identify and plan activities that interest them and support their progress.
- The childminder clearly understands her role with regard to safeguarding and child protection. She understands her responsibility to record and report any concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles and plans to offer children opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands the records she is required to keep that promote children's well-being.
- The childminder continues to maintain a current first-aid certificate. This means she knows how to respond to children's accidents and emergencies.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
