## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of meeting the needs and interests of children through effective planning. She knows how to gather children's starting points and continue to assess their learning and development.
- The childminder knows to provide children with a wide variety of resources in the indoor and outdoor environment to promote their all-round development.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to develop their self-care and awareness skills. She understands how to promote children's understanding of good hygiene practices.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect. She knows the procedures to follow to safeguard children who may be at risk of harm.
- The childminder understands the importance of regularly assessing risks within her home and the outdoor environment to ensure she keeps children safe.
- The childminder develops her own professional practice by attending courses which have a positive impact for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
