Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding procedures to ensure she is able to act quickly and promptly if she has concerns about a child's well-being. She has a clear understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements to promote children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder has suitable procedures to share information with parents so that they are fully informed of children's learning and development.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to promote an inclusive environment. She provides resources that depict positive images to help children to develop a strong sense of belonging and pride.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of how to maintain continuous improvement to promote children's learning and well-being. She gathers useful information about children's individual needs to ensure they are met.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She understands how to plan a varied range of activities according to children's age and abilities to help them make good progress.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector looked at the toys, resources and space available for childminding.
- The inspector looked at available documents and discussed the childminder's policies and procedures with her.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed the childminder's processes for self-evaluation and her plans for further developing her provision.
