Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Children benefit from a stimulating and well-organised indoor environment and can enjoy access to an outside area. They are able to choose from a wide range of resources. Staff understand the need to provide children with exciting activities that strengthen their skills for school.
- Staff have undertaken safeguarding training. As a result, they all understand child protection procedures and their responsibility to protect children in their care.
- Staff are aware of the importance of working in partnership with other early years providers and professionals. They have a clear knowledge of how to develop good communication with them to promote continuity of care, and support children's care and learning.
- Management have a sound understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. They have effective methods for evaluating practice and activities to achieve continual improvement.
- The premises are very safe and secure. The manager understands the importance of close supervision of children and carrying out risk assessments and checks to keep children safe.
- Staff are well qualified and knowledgeable to support all children. Staff demonstrate how they organise the environment to interest children and encourage independence and confidence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector interacted with children and spoke with staff during the inspection.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including policies, evidence of the suitability of staff and qualifications and safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector had a tour of the indoor premises and all outdoor play areas able to be accessed by children.
- The inspector observed the toys and equipment available to children.
- The inspector held a meeting with the manager and the providers.

Kids Kabin (Abbey Lane) was originally registered in 2003. They re-registered in 2011 due to moving to new premises in the same area. It is situated in Beauchief, a suburb of Sheffield. The club is open each weekday, term time only, from 3pm to 6pm, for 38 weeks of the year. The club employs three staff who hold qualifications in play work and early years to a level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the Early Years Foundation Stage.
