## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to provide a warm and welcoming environment in which children can form secure attachments and develop their confidence.
- The childminder uses self-evaluation in order to effectively strengthen her practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings so that children achieve good outcomes.
- The childminder regularly completes training to keep her knowledge and skills current.
- Safeguarding is effective. The childminder meets the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She understands her role and responsibilities in safeguarding children, to promote their welfare, keep them safe and to respond to areas of concern.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands the importance of assessing children's progress from their starting points, in order to plan challenging activities that help them to progress.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children to be independent and develop skills to prepare them for their next stages of learning.
- The childminder has a good range of toys and activities to promote children's learning and development.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of enabling children to contribute their ideas, learn positive behaviours and develop respect for others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
