# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has considered how she will reflect on her practice to improve the quality of her provision. She understands how to include the views of parents and children to improve practice.
- Safeguarding is effective. The childminder has effective safeguarding policies and procedures for keeping children safe and knows how to refer any concerns. She reviews her systems regularly to update herself about any changes to legislation.
- The childminder has an in-depth knowledge of how to promote children's learning in all areas. She has a range of good-quality resources to promote children's development and help them progress.
- The childminder understands how to plan for children's ongoing development from their starting points, through effective assessment procedures that identify all children's learning needs.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of promoting children's good behaviour to help them develop good manners and respect for others. She understands the need for encouraging regular attendance so that children learn successfully.
- The childminder has thought about how she intends to work in partnership with parents to engage them in their child's learning and to keep them updated about children's progress.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
