## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide a clean and welcoming environment for children. She understands how to offer a varied range of good quality resources to promote children's development in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands how children develop over time and how they learn through play and adult-led activities. She understands how to plan for children's learning, including those children who are preparing for the move to school.
- The childminder understands how to recognise gaps in children's development and plan stimulating activities to help children make progress. She understands how to support all children's learning, regardless of their ages, backgrounds and abilities.
- The childminder understands the need to teach children about positive behaviour and how to respect each other. She knows how to promote children's self-esteem and confidence as they make choices in their play.
- The childminder has a thorough knowledge of safeguarding issues. She understands the signs when a child may be at risk of harm and has clear procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's well-being.
- The childminder keeps up-to-date with current guidance so that she can review and improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector reviewed evidence of the childminder's qualifications and suitability to care for children.
