- The childminder maintains records with relevant details of any children she cares for.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing an effective partnership with parents in order to meet the needs of the children.
- The childminder understands the importance of a healthy lifestyle for children and the promotion of this through fresh air, exercise and a healthy diet.

There were no children present when this inspection took place.
