Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider and manager have an understanding of safeguarding and child protection issues to enable them to proceed if they have any concerns about a child's welfare. Safeguarding is effective and the provider understands and implements all the statutory requirements.
- The manager knows how to carry out visual checks and risk assessments to identify and reduce the risk of potential hazards to children. The premises are safe, secure and equipped with toys and resources suitable for age and stage of children's development.
- The manager understands the importance of promoting children's good health through daily routines, nutritious snacks and exercises.
- The manager knows the importance of working in partnership with parents, schools and others in order to meet the needs of the children and promote continuity of care and learning.
- The manager understands how to plan and provide a varied range of activities to complement what children do at school and help them to make progress.
- The manager has an understanding of how to manage children's behaviour so that they know the boundaries at the setting, respect and treat others kindly.
- The provider and manager know how to further develop their childcare knowledge through training. They also know to seek guidance from external support agencies to update and improve practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held a meeting with the provider and manager and discussed the procedures and practices used at the club.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, such as, the manager's qualification and training certificates, safeguarding and child protection policies, record of the risk assessment and evidence of staff employment.
- The inspector went on a tour of the premises with the manager and examined some of the resources for children.

The Holiday Fun Club play scheme registered in 2008 and operates from the John Loughborough School in Tottenham in the London Borough of Haringey. The club is managed by the Seven Day Adventist Church. The club operates during the school holidays between the hours of 10am and 5pm from Mondays to Thursdays and 10am to 2pm on Fridays. The club employs five members of staff, of these, three hold level 3 qualifications in early years. At the time of inspection, there were no children on roll.
