Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. The childminder has a suitable knowledge and understanding of the signs and symptoms of abuse. She is clear on how to respond should a concern arise about a child's welfare.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the range of ways in which she can educate children about healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals to create a consistent approach to meeting the needs of children.
- The childminder holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 2. She understands the importance of professional development to help her reflect upon and improve her service.
- The childminder understands how to support children's learning to help them reach their full potential. She understands the resources she will need to keep children stimulated.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to provide children with emotional support to help them to settle into her care.
- The childminder understands how to support children in acquiring the key skills they need for their next stage in learning.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of how to monitor the work of her assistant.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all of the childminder's documentation.
- The inspector talked with the childminder throughout the inspection.
- The inspector sampled records and documentation relating to the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector observed the areas that children would have access to along with resources and equipment that would be used.
- The inspector viewed training certificates and checked evidence of the childminder's suitability.
