Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The management team understand how to implement all the requirements and promote children's safety. They complete checks on all staff to make sure they are suitable to work with children. Staff receive child protection training so they know what to do if they have concerns about a child's welfare.
- The manager and staff check the areas of the building used by children to make sure they are safe before they arrive. They plan activities so children learn how to keep themselves safe.
- The management team recognise the importance of working closely with parents so staff understand children's needs. Staff use this information to plan activities which complement children's learning from other settings and school.
- The management team have arrangements in place to monitor staff performance through supervision and appraisal. They encourage staff to train to improve their teaching skills, continue their professional development and improve the outcomes for children.
- Managers use effective self-evaluation to reflect and plan for improvements. They seek feedback from parents and children to help them identify areas for development.
- The management team have a clear understanding of how to manage and promote children's good behaviour. They encourage all staff to attend training to help them to teach children to be kind and respectful.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at a range of relevant documentation relating to safeguarding and staff suitability, as well as policies, procedures.
- The inspector talked to the provider about the arrangements to meet children's individual needs of children, and how staff plan to provide a suitable range of play experiences.
- The inspector talked to the provider about their knowledge of the requirements and safeguarding children.
- The inspector checked the arrangements for promoting children's personal development and good behaviour.
