## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The provider and staff attend ongoing child protection training. They have a secure knowledge of child protection procedures. They know their responsibility to report any concerns they may have about the welfare of children.
- The provider has systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, risk assessments are regularly reviewed and all hazards are minimised so that staff can promote children's safety.
- The provider and staff understand how to promote children's well-being. They know how to manage children's behaviour positively. They know how to support children's healthy development, such as through providing a range of healthy food for children's snacks.
- The provider and staff offer a welcoming environment. They know how to provide children with activities that complement their learning elsewhere. Good quality resources are plentiful and stored in ways that children can easily access. Resources are obtained to reflect children's interests and abilities and to help them respect and value diversity.
- The provider gains information from parents and children in order to be able to support children's individual care and learning needs throughout their time at the club.
- There are robust arrangements for staff recruitment and vetting, as well as staff supervision and training opportunities so staff can promote children's enjoyment and safety.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider how she intends to support children's play and learning.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and documents the provider will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability and qualifications of staff, and talked to the provider about her self-evaluation and improvement plans.

Wesley Playcentre was registered in 2013. It is run by Sandwell Adventure Play Association. It employs two members of childcare staff. Both hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3. The centre is open from Monday to Friday, term time only. Sessions are from 3pm until 6pm.
