## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements and how to help children make progress.
- The childminder has a suitable range of toys and resources to help meet children's needs, and support their learning.
- The childminder knows how to take the necessary measures to keep her home safe and secure for children. She attends regular training to ensure that, if she had concerns about a child's welfare, she knows what action to take to keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's well-being, for example, through healthy food, drinks and daily exercise.
- The childminder knows how to teach children about respecting and valuing the needs of others, to learn about positive behaviours towards their friends.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to working in partnership with parents and other people involved in children's lives.
- The childminder fully understands the importance of self-evaluation to continuously improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
