Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider/manager has established safeguarding systems. She, and her staff, have a strong knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues, and who to contact in the event of a concern about children's safety and welfare. The manager ensures her staff are suitable to work with children.
- The provider/manager has a secure understanding of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands the need to provide children with a range of interesting and stimulating activities to meet their individual needs.
- The provider/manager understands the value of working in partnerships with schools and parents to promote continuity in children's learning and well-being. Parents provide very positive feedback about the way the after-school club is run and the services provided.
- The management team regularly evaluates the setting with staff and ensures they take into account parents' and children's views.
- The provider/manager makes the use of training available to support her staff's further development and to gain appropriate childcare qualifications.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector held conversations with the provider/manager, staff and parents during the inspection.
- The inspector sampled required documentation, including policies and procedures, and discussed the manager's understanding of the requirements.
- The inspector checked evidence of the provider/manager's and staff's suitability and qualifications.

- The inspector looked at self-evaluation records.

The MSE Play Club opened in 2010 and operates from the Sally Castle Building, located within the grounds of Ealdham Primary School in Eltham. The club is open between 3pm and 6:30pm during term time only. The holiday playscheme operates between 7.45am and 6.30pm during school holidays only. The provider employs four staff, three of whom hold a relevant childcare qualification at level 3. There were no children in the early years range on roll during the inspection.
