Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not meet requirements. She has not made Ofsted aware of all adults living on the premises so the relevant suitability checks can be undertaken for those aged 16 years and over.
- The childminder understands the need to offer a welcoming environment for children. She knows how to provide a suitable range of resources for children of different ages, backgrounds and abilities to aid their development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's development to provide a consistent approach and to meet children's needs. She knows the need to provide parents with regular feedback about their children's progress and the importance of encouraging them to support learning at home.
- The childminder knows how to offer an inclusive service so that children learn to accept and value each other's similarities and differences.
- The childminder understands how to prepare children for the next stages in their learning and their move to school or nursery. She knows the importance of promoting their independence and personal skills.
- The childminder knows the importance of risk assessing her premises to make them safe for children. She recognises the signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of undertraining training to keep up to date and of evaluating her service in order to improve it.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

ensure that Ofsted is notified of all persons living on the premises 18/11/2015 aged 16 years and over by completing and returning the required forms in a timely manner, to allow required checks to be undertaken.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured all the premises available for childminding.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the requirements.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation.
