#### Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to safeguard children. She can identify signs and symptoms that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare and the procedures to follow to report these.
- The childminder knows how to identify children's starting points and use observation and assessment of children's learning in order to plan activities that will challenge and encourage their continual development and ongoing progress.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She is aware of the need to provide parents with regular feedback about children's care and learning.
- The childminder is aware of her role and responsibility in meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and other Government legislation.
- The childminder knows how to prepare children for the next stages in their learning and their move to school or nursery. She understands the importance of promoting their independence and personal care skills, to help them develop the skills they will need for their future learning.
- The childminder understands the need to provide children with daily outdoor experiences to promote their physical development and good health.
- They childminder offers children a healthy balanced diet. For example, she encourages children to eat vegetables by planting and growing them in her garden.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector sampled documents that the childminder has available for childminding.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
