The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the signs and symptoms that may cause her to be concerned about a child's well-being. She also understands the procedures to follow to promote children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's progress. She understands how to help children make good progress through effective learning experiences, so that they develop the necessary skills ready for school.
- The childminder has sound systems in place to promote children's personal development, behaviour and well-being. She has clear strategies for managing children's behaviour and to help them gain a positive sense of themselves and an understanding of others.
- The childminder has a positive attitude towards her professional development and improving her practice. She regularly reflects on her practice in order to identify areas for improvement and any additional training needs.
- The childminder has addressed the recommendations from the last inspection, which has enabled her to improve safety procedures and improve the quality of her teaching.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working with parents and others. For example, she knows that regularly sharing information with them is important in providing consistency in children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
