Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder continuously attends training. This helps to keep her knowledge of changes to early years practice up to date and strengthens her professionalism.
- The childminder attends safeguarding training and has a secure awareness of the procedures follow if she has any child protection concerns. She provides a safe and secure environment and she completes regular safety checks.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing good relationships with parents. For example, she explains that she shares her policies and procedures with parents to make them aware of her roles and responsibilities.
- The childminder knows how to promote positive behaviour. For example, she explains that she sets clear boundaries and provides children with clear explanations of acceptable and unwanted behaviour to support their understanding.
- The childminder understands how to observe, assess and plan for children's learning across all areas of learning. She knows how to provide a good balance of planned activities and those children can choose for themselves.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including the childminder's training certificates, insurance policy, records of attendance, and safeguarding policy.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder.
- The inspector undertook a tour of the premises.
- The inspector sampled children's records.

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Canning Town in the London borough of Newham. The childminder opens each weekday all year round. The childminder hold level 4 management childcare qualification. At the time of the inspection there were no children on roll in the early years age group.
